Construct Tomorrow

Construct Tomorrow is planting seeds of opportunity across Minnesota—one student at a time. This nonprofit hosts 8–10 events annually, each designed to introduce high school students (grades 9–12) to the world of union construction trades. Their message is clear: you don't need a four-year degree to build a successful, fulfilling career.

Through hands-on experiences and direct engagement with trade professionals, Construct Tomorrow helps young people envision a future in the skilled trades. Their events highlight apprenticeship programs and emphasize the value of union training, safety standards, and long-term career stability. Volunteers play a vital role in making these events possible. Union-affiliated contractors, tradespeople, and organizations are invited to participate, offering guidance and inspiration to the next generation. A 12-member board of directors—made up of union-affiliated leaders—helps steer the program's growth and impact.

Building Strong Communities supports Construct Tomorrow's work by providing essential funding and grant support. BSC also joins events to share its own

resources, helping expand the reach and deepen the impact of Construct Tomorrow's mission.

As Construct Tomorrow continues to grow, its focus remains firm: champion union trades, promote apprenticeship programs, and empower young people with real-world options for success.
